ASHE PROJECT OF THE YEAR WINNERS

Under \$5 million & Peer's Choice: U.S. 23/Pennsylvania Avenue Improvement Project


Owner: City of Delaware

Consultant: ms consultants

Contractor: Trucco Construction

Construction Cost: \$2.2 million

The U.S. 23/Pennsylvania Avenue Improvement Project (DEL-23-13.17) was a cost-effective, low-impact solution to provide safer, more direct, access from and to U.S. 23 for north Delaware. More traditional alternatives of constructing a full interchange would have impacted the adjacent Historic Northwest District and the Olentangy River floodplain, and would have cost \$8 million more to build than this \$2.5 million project. By designing and building this less costly, innovative solution, the City was able to take advantage of available funding and accelerate the implementation of a safer, more efficient access to the north side of Delaware without precluding the construction of a full movement interchange if needed in the future.




Construction Cost: \$30.4 million

Delaware County – the fastest growing county in Ohio – now has a new direct connection to the Columbus metro area, thanks to the completion of the Sawmill Parkway Extension Project. Completed in November 2016, the new road reduces commute times for travelers and opens up 1,600 acres of land for development. With a portion of the project located within City limits, the City of Delaware calls the 4.5-mile roadway extension, "The City of Delaware's most significant transportation project for the last 30 years."

The four-lane divided roadway includes five roundabouts and a bike path along the entire length. Burgess & Niple (B&N) provided planning, design, preliminary engineering, and environmental services along with public involvement assistance. The total design cost was \$4 million. The total project construction cost was \$30.4 million, more than \$3 million under the budgeted amount of \$33.5 million.






Columbus Crew Event

Our luncheon at OTEC will feature an update from the ASHE National President, Greg Dutton. In addition, the Great Lakes Region Project of the Year winners will be announced and this year's ASHE Central Ohio scholarship winners will be recognized.



GREG DUTTON, PE - ASHE National President

Mr. Dutton joined the Northeast Florida Section of ASHE in 2003 as a government employee at the encouragement of a manager who was very involved and who promoted DOT Engineers to participate. In 2007 while working as a Senior Engineer/Construction Project Manager for the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), he was asked by the ASHE Northeast Florida Section to serve as their Regional Director. Service on the Section Board involved acting as a liaison between the Region and Section, planning activities with the officers and committee chairs to foster more involvement by members and students, increasing awareness of ASHE's purpose and vision, raising funds for scholarships, providing industry information to customers, and reaching out to the community. Serving was no chore because the Section's leadership had so much fun along the way.

Mr. Dutton graduated from the University of Florida (UF) in 1991 with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Civil Engineering. He joined the Florida Department of Transportation as a Project Engineer, managing road and bridge construction projects. In 2007, after taking on the role of ASHE Regional Director, Greg joined the private industry and opened an office in Jacksonville for a transportation consulting firm performing Construction Engineering and Inspection (CEI). In 2013, Greg was elected as an ASHE National Director representing the SE Region and served on the scanner, Public Relations, National Conference, and Regional Oversight committees. After working for a couple of years in SW Florida managing I-75 widening projects, he now works for Volkert, Inc. out of Orlando on the I4 Ultimate project and with their Florida CEI operations. He stays active attending ASHE Section events in Florida and occasionally attending ASHE Section events in other areas of the country. As the ASHE National 1st Vice President this past year, Mr. Dutton has served on the Executive Committee, Budget/Audit, scanner, and Strategic Plan committees.
